

## Street art brightens local streets and laneways

The paint has dried after the Big Picture Fest in Frankston making a significant impression locally.

Seven headline and 29 local artists used 1,100 cans of spray paint, 300 litres of bucket paint and worked across a week in March to transform drab walls into masterpieces.

The Big Picture Fest 2018 was funded through the city's Street Art Masterplan, part of the Victorian Government's \$63 million Frankston Station Precinct Redevelopment.
