Frankston Arts Precinct is home to the Frankston Arts Centre (FAC), Cube 37 and the Frankston Library and is the ideal first stop for arts, theatre and inspiration.

Frankston Arts Centre presents Australian and International theatre, from music and dance to drama and comedy in its 800-seat theatre. The foyer hosts a life-size sculpture of Dame Elisabeth Murdoch, and displays art and jewellery by local artists available for sale.

The FAC and Cube 37 Galleries display contemporary art by professional artists and community arts organisations, with exhibitions changing every three-nine weeks with most works available for purchase. Cube 37's striking glass wall on Davey Street is a digital art gallery, featuring photographic and video projections after dark. Cube 37 is also the hub for workshops where you can get creative with art, circus and writing.

At Frankston Library, visitors can see items from the local history collection, temporary cultural exhibitions and community displays. The Library holds free public events including author talks, workshops and live music every second Sunday.

The Arts Precinct is served by an affordable undercover car park off Young Street.

McClelland Sculpture Park + Gallery is set in 16 hectares of beautifully landscaped Australian native gardens and bushland and hosts a picturesque licensed café on site, as well as a retail outlet. Discover over 100 outdoor works on permanent display by leading Australian sculptors and year round the award-winning gallery presents a vibrant program of exhibitions, public lectures and art events. The biennial McClelland Sculpture Survey is open from 23 November 2014 until 19 July 2015 and is the most prestigious award for outdoor sculpture in Australia. The Park is open Tuesday-Sunday 10am-5pm, entry by donation.

Cruden Farm

Cruden Farm is the much loved home of the late Dame Elisabeth Murdoch. It was given to her as a wedding present by her husband, Sir Keith Murdoch, in 1928. Eighty four years of hands-on involvement by Dame Elisabeth has transformed the landscape of Cruden Farm into one of Australia's most iconic and aesthetically pleasing country gardens. Situated on 133 acres the property consists of an internationally recognised garden, beautiful rolling paddocks and pockets of indigenous vegetation. Visit on designated open days or by appointment. Please note that the house is not open for viewing.
